The European Championship and The World Cup

Ireland and the UK have formed part of a joint bid to host the 2030 World Cup. The World Cup seldom makes a profit and often registers a loss, but it gives dramatic exposure to the host countries, being the biggest sporting event in the world. For Ireland and the UK, co-hosting the World Cup a decade after Brexit could have a healing significance and help to resolve the rift between them. It would symbolise the capacity to co-operate that has been so riven by Brexit by sending a signal that, whatever about the politico-economic divergence between the two countries, we are able to unite in sport and play host to the world. That narrative may have sounded good and have been a plausible aspiration up until early July. It is a beaten docket now.



What killed the chances of Ireland and the UK hosting the 2030 World Cup was the behaviour of English football fans

during the European Championship, hosted by England this June and July. While most English fans behaved decently, a significant portion of them did not. The signs of disruption were there from the start. Booing opposing teams' national anthems became de rigueur, as did booing players who 'took the knee' in solidarity with the Black Lives Matter movement. Sectarian and racist songs echoed from the stands. The iconic

Wembley Stadium, where England played Italy in the final, saw a stampede of thousands of unticketed fans breach security to attend the game. Oh, and there was the complete lack of social distancing and mask-wearing. All in all, it was not a good look.

The inquiries into legal and ethical breaches are underway. Already, the governing body of the European Championship, UEFA, has imposed fines on England FA in response to an English fan shining a laser on the opposition goal-keeper's face in advance of a penalty in the semi-final. More fines, and probably sanctions, are likely to ensue.

Among the most painful travesties of the competition was the way in which three of the English footballers - Marcus Rashford, Jadon Sancho and Bukayo Saka - were targeted by some fans after missing penalties in the final. The players, who are heroes to many English children, happen to be black and they were demonised by racists when they missed their spot-kicks. The treatment they received online and - in graffiti throughout the country - has prompted national outrage in England.

Yet condemnation and punishment of the behaviour of fans lets a considerable swathe of English politicians off the hook. At the start of the competition, Home Secretary Priti Patel dismissed English players who took the knee before games: 'I just don't support people participating in that type of gesture politics'. Patel's comment has been blamed by many for augmenting race tensions. Prime Minister Johnson has expressed his usual farrago of contradictions and bluster.

One player who took the knee, Marc Rashford, gained a political profile last year by launching a successful petition to extend the right to school meals to include holiday periods. Successfully forcing the prime minister's hand did nothing to curry favour in Johnson's cab-


inet. However, Priti Patel is on the wrong side of history on this debate, and she has already been forced into sounding a conciliatory note.

Violence from English fans has a long


history, as we know in Ireland. When Ireland played England in Dublin on February 15th 1995 the game was called off after the English fans started a riot, ripping out stadium seats and casting them onto the field and lower stands. Perfunctory anti-IRA sentiment continues to emanate from some English fans when England plays Ireland: 'With St George in my heart keep me English, keep me English till my dying day/ No surrender, no surrender, no surrender to the IRA' - a song they learned from Glasgow Rangers' fans. (Neither has a section of the Irish population covered itself in glory during international football fixtures. On June 15th 1996, during the European Championship hosted by England, the IRA denoted a van bomb in Manchester, injuring 212 civilians).

Still, violence and anti-social behaviour from English fans has become more and more routine and the European Championship saw new lows from them. So, it is worthwhile trying to identify the source of the English football fans' rage. One of the chants that animated them was 'football's coming home' bears a striking resemblance to the slogan around which many Brexiteers rallied: 'taking back control'. There were many motives behind Brexit - a momentum that managed to unite voters in post-industrial cities as much as the monied classes in England - but one of them was certainly racism: the fantasy that England could return to a former (white) glory.

Brexit will have a lasting effect on Britain's economy, but also on its culture. Britain's weakening economy and diminishing status in the world is turning avowed Brexiteers, who have embraced a narcissistic fantasy of English exceptionalism, more inward. The behaviour of English football fans by no means represents the entire Brexit project but they are among the country's most extreme jingoists. At such international sports competitions, they are 'ambassadors' of the new Britain, and the international community is far from impressed by what they see. Is it any wonder that Boris Johnson has prohibited his ministers from using the word Brexit except as 'as a historical event that took place on January 31, 2020'. But its effects cannot be so easily compartmentalised and history has a habit of haunting miscreants.





Irish Books and Plays in Review

Green Crime Fiction

Ireland is a modern European country with well-educated, confident young people. The Catholic Church always worked against any modern social change, but its power has declined to almost nothing. These positive developments have greatly accelerated change; the Good Friday Agreement/1998 ended the civil war in Northern Ireland.

For those reasons, Irish crime fiction has experienced enormous growth. Crime fiction includes mysteries, murder mysteries, police procedurals, psychological suspense novels, and many many more kinds of crime fiction. Irish crime fiction is often called Green or Emerald Noir. Webster's Dictionary describes noir as "crime fiction with...cynical characters. But, despite cynicism, the noir detective continues the struggle against evil." Noir writing shows that occasionally, one person can defeat evil and restore order in

mystery puzzles that give the reader pleasure when we watch them unfold. This form of fiction often displays insightful and sharply drawn character observations and beautiful descriptions of meet someone, but as he waits,

Ireland is a small country, but despite its small size, it produces many first-rate writers of mysteries. I keep a file of 18 Irish authors whose books I have repeatedly purchased and reviewed for the Irish American News. I greatly enjoyed reading the new crime mystery, Snow, by John Banville. The review of it was published here in February. I ordered the new book, by David Pearson, Lethal in Small Doses. He cited the other books in Connemara. This book is situated in Dublin and is about a police investigation of a serial killer who is targeting care homes for the elderly. Pearson's descriptions of nature are insightful and emotionally powerful.

Some of the beauty of Connemara is shown in this description Crime fiction usually contains of Detective Maureen Lyons. She



On The Law

So Someone Got Injured As a Result of a Party You Threw

As pandemic restrictions are lifting and we are into summer, events and celebrations will once again resume. Whether a pandemic-postponed graduation party celebration, or a simple summer barbeque, alcohol will likely be a part of the celebrations to come. As exciting as the return of celebrating with friends and family may be, adult responsibility for distribution of alcohol must be kept in mind in order to avoid potential serious consequences to the host of the party. Currently, most states have some form of law dealing with "social host responsibility." Hosts of underage drinking situations can be civilly or criminally liable for what occurs at their homes, whether or not they are aware that drinking is occurring. Since 2004 in Illinois, the Social Host Law holds adults accountable for serving or providing alcohol to a minor or permitting the use of



ity for "any person at least 18 years of age who willfully supplies alcoholic liquor or illegal drugs to a person under 18 years of age." Under the statute, the victim can recover economic damages, non-economic damages, attorney's fees, and in some circumstances punitive damages.

The Act was passed by the Illinois legislature in response to two high profile cases. The first involved a 16-year-old girl who died as a result of drinking at a friend's house. The second case involved a hazing ritual in 2003 between junior and senior high school girls from a north suburb. In both cases, parents were aware of the underage a parent or homeowner over drinking.

In the first case, the mother of the 16-year-old brought action against two brothers and their father for negligence in providing a bottle of injuries to persons or property

Goldschlager to the teenager. The plaintiff's daughter lost consciousness after drinking the bottle of liqueur, dying later that day. The mother argued that her daughter, a minor, could not appreciate the dangers associated with consumption of excessive amounts of alcoholic beverages. The mother could not pursue a "social host" theory against the family because at that time there was no statute imposing that duty upon them. However, the mother was able to pursue a "voluntary undertaking" theory alleging the defendants undertook care for her daughter but did so negligently.

The second case involved a highly covered hazing ritual that was videotaped between junior and senior high school girls. The video of a drunken battle between the high school girls was played on national television. Five girls were hospitalized. Thirty one students, twenty eight females, and three males were suspended from school, some later expelled due to the off-campus incident. Media attention focused on how such a large number of minors were able to obtain alcohol for the event. Two mothers of students were later charged for providing alcohol to the teens.

Under the current law, if the age of 18 serves or allows alcohol consumption by anyone under the age of 18 at their home which causes the impairment, they may be liable for caused by that impairment. It is important to note that an adult can be held liable whether or not they provide the alcohol and whether or not they are present during the occurrence.

The statute covers not only injuries to the teen but also to any third-party victims of the intoxication. If the intoxicated teenager leaves the home and gets into an accident, the homeowner providing the alcohol may be responsible not only for the injuries suffered by the teen but also the injuries suffered by any other person involved in the accident.

The Law Prevents Blaming

Looking to place responsibility on the responsible adults, the legislators specifically eliminated any theory of contributory negligence of the minor from the statute. The Act states, "Neither contributory negligence nor contributory willful and wanton conduct shall apply to any injured party claiming damages under this Act." It does not matter that the minor may be acting carelessly, the By homeowner may still be found liable for their actions.

Liability in

Non-Residential Settings

The statute makes a distinction between residential and non-residential settings. In a residential setting, an adult will be held liable for the actions of the impaired minor if any person over the age of 18 "willfully supplies" alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs. In non-residential settings (not specifically defined in the statute), the Act provides that the adult may be held liable for simply "permitting" consumption of alcohol by a minor on their non-residential premises. The statute emphasizes that in a non-residential setting an adult does not have to buy or supply the minors with alcohol, but merely allows it to be consumed to be found liable.

The Act is another example of the no nonsense approach the State of Illinois takes to teen drinking. Everyone should be aware of this as gatherings begin to occur again in the coming months. It is important this summer and for future events to make every effort to comply with the Act so that you can enjoy social gatherings with family and friends without facing the consequences of permitting underage drinking.

Ireland Should Accept Secretary Yellen's Global Corporate Tax Deal

Since taking office, one of President Biden's top policy priorities has been forcing the wealthy to pay their fair share in taxes. As an arm of the new administration, Secretary of the Treasury Janet Yellen is determined to achieve that goal. Her first big test? Con-

vincing countries around the world to agree to an unprecedented minimum global corporate tax rate.

gapore. Under Yellen's proposal, signatories would still be allowed to raise their corporate tax rates above the minimum threshold, which will be at least 15%, but would be prohibited from having a corporate tax rate below it.

Ratifying a treaty of this mag-

nitude would be a huge victory for the Biden administration, but there are a few obstacles that stand in its way. Some are domestic: the Constitution requires two-thirds of the Senate to vote in favor of ratification before an international treaty can go into effect. This would mean that Senate Democrats would need to curry the favor of 17 Republican Senators in order for the treaty to go into effect. Before that process can even happen, however, Secretary Yellen has to convince a few key holdout countries that the merits of the treaty outweigh any potential drawbacks. One of these holdouts is Ireland.

As many of you are aware, Ireland has experienced enormous and unprecedented economic growth in the years since former Finance Minister Charlie McCreevy reduced the corporate tax rate in Ireland from 32% to 12.5% in 1999. Ireland's low corporate tax rate and its many tax loopholes has made Éire prime real estate for massive corporations to move their headquarters overseas through a process known as tax inversion.

Tax inversion occurs when a company like Apple buys a smaller, Irish company and utilizes that company's credentials to move

its corporate headquarters to the Emerald Isle. Thus, instead of paying U.S. taxes, Apple pays Irish taxes, and can often get away with paying a rate even lower than the "headline" tax of 12.5% using loopholes. Despite this, tax inversion has bolstered the Irish economy and created thousands of good-paying jobs for those living on the island. In 2016-2017, 80% of the corporate tax rate paid to the government was by foreign-owned businesses, and these businesses employed a quarter of Ireland's workforce.

Thus, Irish officials are worried about how joining a global corporate tax treaty might impact its economy. While the US is seeking to bring its corporations back stateside, Ireland is seeking to retain them for its own benefit. However, I still believe it would be short-sighted for Ireland to opt out of the tax treaty.

Opting out of the tax treaty could negatively impact Ireland's economy much more than joining the treaty would. While penalties for not joining the treaty haven't been fully hammered out yet, Ireland could easily find itself caught in a web of damaging economic sanctions from signatories of the deal. These sanctions could severely limit Ireland's trading partners and ultimately cause an economic collapse.

Second, by joining the treaty, Ireland could make more tax money without necessarily losing its foreign investment. If the proposed global corporate tax rate remains at 15%, Ireland would

only have to increase its own corporate tax rate by 2.5% to be in compliance. Providing a minimum tax threshold could also secure Ireland's economic place in the future, as the "race to the bottom" between competing countries seeking to bring in the most foreign investment will grind to a halt if a uniform minimum global corporate tax rate is established.

Lastly, a major provision of Yellen's tax deal could bode well for Ireland even if major foreign firms decide to exit the country. Yellen's proposal closes a loophole that many multinational companies have used to avoid paying an income tax in any one country. Her proposed reform will allow any signatory of the treaty to tax companies for the profit they make in their country, regardless of where their physical headquarters are based. This means that Ireland will be able to tax the profits of companies like Apple when those profits are made at the expense of Irish citizens.

To sum up, Ireland finds itself at a crossroads when it comes to the deal proposed by Secretary Yellen: should it continue to abide by its unfair tax practices that have bolstered its own economy while effectively robbing other countries of their own tax dollars? Or should the government opt in to a new, revolutionary treaty that would herald in an unprecedented amount of international cooperation and good will, all while forcing Big Tech to pay their fair share? I believe that the choice is clear.

"A few years ago we did a ride, and one of the benefactors of the ride was Bravehearts in McHenry, and it was an absolutely fantastic operation to see, and the dedication of those people in helping our veterans was absolutely tremendous to see firsthand."

The ride has been put together by Mr. Duggan, and has received much support from many groups in the area.

"I cannot express the thanks to all the agencies that are helping me with this ride," says Mr. Duggan. "Any ride, any venture, cannot come together without a solid team."

Fond memories of visiting America as a child, on holiday with his family (which his mother, he says, 'saved like crazy for'), and seeing the World Trade Center towers for the first time, have inspired Mr. Duggan to spearhead the tributes to memorialize the 9/11 tragedy.



Forty-odd years ago I learned about fitting into an Irish town and it wasn't to go on like Bailey did. Denis Quinlan, who at that time ran The Courtyard Bar in Schull, recalls the 6' 3" figure of Bailey calling the pub to attention and reciting some of his poetry whilst everyone was supposed to stay guiet and listen to him. The drink-

ers of Schull are obviously more these blusterers.

tolerant than some that I've hung out with over the years, I can tell you that for nothing. As Quinlan says: "Once I got to know him, I Whatever one's feelings on the was guite happy if he did not come in here." Bit of an understatement I would think.

However, just because a man is a loudmouth and a clown does not make him a murderer. Unfortunately for Bailey, though, he just can't stop talking. I mean, this fella loves the sound of his own voice. Even when it came out that he had a history of violence towards women he couldn't help himself. Just couldn't. Concerning one altercation with his partner Jules Thomas, in which he had torn her lip away from her gum, pulled out tufts of her hair and left her eye so badly damaged that she almost lost it, this man made it all about him: they had both been drinking and 'it takes two to tango'. No wonder he wanted the Netflix interviews pulled.

Yet again just because a man is a loudmouth, a clown, a blowhard, writer of bad poetry (which he insists on reciting even when he's being questioned), violent and an admitted beater of women doesn't mean that he's a murderer.

And it really doesn't: by God, was this a botched investigation from the start.

I took a liking to Eugene Gilligan, the forensic expert who led a team from Dublin; less so to Dermot Dwyer, the Detective Superintendent from Cork who has to be seen to be believed. One of those smug hail-fellowwell-met types, who just make my teeth ache.

I almost swallowed my tongue in laughter when Bailey described him as 'a psychopathic criminal wearing the uniform of a garda.' And there's Detective Dermot Dwyer (who is amusingly described as a Columbo, at which point I thought my ribs were going to give out) saying: 'I told him the man who did this is local, a headcase and I've a good idea who that is and I think that you've a good idea.'

I'd love to have been in that room, listening to the two of

Detective Dwyer might have had something to bluster about if in the meantime the garda had not forgotten to take photographs of the wounds and scratches that were on Bailey's arms and brow (although they did do a drawing, to be fair).

Or lost an entire gate that was to be used in evidence, seeing as how it was next to Ms. du Plantier's body and was splashed with blood. And when I say gate, I don't mean one of those garden things that you pull shut behind you when you're on your way to the old 9 to 5; I'm talking about a bloody great gate that you let cattle through. How the hell do you lose that from a small village evidence room?

I have no idea where that gate is today, but I like to think it has Lord Lucan riding Shergar on the far side of it.

Toma McCullim, who had come to the village in the 80s, was another who came across to me as likeable, but again had a strange story of police methods of the time. A self-described lesbian-feminist, she said that after the murder a garda came around with a photo of the victim and asked:

"Well, what do you think of this woman? Could she be... a lesbian?"

It's incredible, really. It's only 25 years ago and yet it sounds like something straight out of 'Father Ted'. Maybe he thought it was contagious; maybe there was a theory going around that an outbreak of lesbian activity was leading to murder in West Cork. Who knows?

And it is of course all too easy to be flippant. And unfair. Human, but terribly unfair. Because a woman died. And hopefully we will eventually see some kind of resolution to the pain of her family.

This is how her son Pierre remembers her:

"The house in Ireland, for me, is the only place I would go with my mother - and where I continue to go today. It's like going to see her. It's like going to stay with her every time. Mum is very present in this house."

With her blend of folk melodies, synthesized backdrops, and classical motifs, Enya created a distinctive style that more closely resembled new age than the folk and Celtic music that provided her initial influences. Enya is from Gweedore, County Donegal, Ireland, which she left in 1980 to join the Irish band Clannad, the group that already featured her older brothers and sisters. She stayed with Clannad for two years, then left, hooking up with producer Nicky Ryan and lyricist Roma Ryan, with whom she

recorded film and television scores. The result was a successful album of TV music for the BBC. Enya then recorded "Watermark" (1988), which featured her distinctive, flowing music and multi-overdubbed trancelike singing; the album sold four million copies worldwide. "Watermark" established Enya as an international star and launched a successful career that lasted well into the '90s.


Enya (born Eithne Ní Bhraonáin) was born into a musical family. Her father, Leo Brennan, was the leader of the Slieve Foy Band, a popular Irish show band; her mother was an amateur mu-

sician. Most importantly to Enya's career, were her siblings, who formed Clannad in 1976 with several of their uncles. Enya joined the band as a keyboardist in 1979, and contributed to several of the group's popular television soundtracks. In 1982, she left Clannad, claiming that she was uninterested in following the pop direction the group had begun to pursue. Within a few years, she was commissioned to provide the score for a BBC-TV series called "The Celts." The soundtrack was released in 1986 as her eponymous solo album.

Enya didn't receive much notice, but Enya and the Ryans' second effort, "Watermark", became a surprise hit upon its release in 1988. "Orinoco Flow," the first single, became a number one hit in Britain, helping the album eventually sell eight million copies worldwide. Enya spent the years following the success of "Watermark" rather quietly; her most notable appearance was a cameo on Sinéad O'Connor's album "I Do Not Want

What I Haven't Got." She finally released "Shepherd Moons," her follow-up to "Watermark", in 1991. "Shepherd Moons" was even more successful than its predecessor, eventually selling over ten million copies worldwide; it entered the U.S. charts at number 17 and remained in the Top 200 for almost four years.

Again, Enya was slow to follow up on the success of "Shepherd Moons," spending



nearly four years working on her fourth album. The record, entitled "Memory of Trees", was released in December of 1995. "Memory of Trees" entered the U.S. charts at number nine and sold over two million copies within its first year of release. 1997

saw the release of a greatest-hits collection, "Paint the Sky with Stars: The Best of Enya", which featured two new songs. Enya's first album of new material in five years, "A Day Without Rain", was released in late 2000.

At the time of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon on September 11, 2001, Enya's single Only Time, was used as a theme for the underlying sense of loss and triumph of the rescue workers. She would later donate her profits from the song to the Firefighters Fund that was set up in response to the event.

The Lord of the Rings trilogy also gave her music a wider audience. Her song on the Lord of the Ring - The Fellowship of the Ring helped the album to go platinum. In addition, she was nominated for an Academy Award for 2002 Best Song Nomination for The Fellowship of the Ring, as well as a Golden Globe in 2002 for Best Song Nomination for The Fellowship of the Ring. Her music was also heard in The Two Towers and The Return of the King.

Enya does not tour, and her public performances have been limited to special occasions. Enya is still extremely popular throughout the world. Next to U2 she is the top-selling Irish artist in the United States with total sales of over 22 million albums.

Swans bring a sense of comfort, tranquility and peace of mind and it's no wonder the male Alfie became agitated when ski riders took pleasure in provoking him. New Jersey should take a page from New York's Governor Andrew Cuomo who passed legislation in 2014 blocking conservation officials from setting a goal of eliminating all swans.

Allegedly the swans were damaging ducks and geese while running a risk to passenger jets.

The story of the *Children of Lir* immortalized in Irish folklore involves a widowed King left to raise four children. He remarhave issued formal complaints ried and as is often the case,

A vicious nasty stepmother, she cast a spell turning the children into swans. Not only was the curse harsh, it had a lifetime of 600 years. The first 300 years the swans were banished to a lake, followed by another 300 in the Sea of Moyle, a cold, vicious narrow expanse of sea in the North Channel between County Antrim in the North of Scotland. According to folklore the twelve-mile body of water was so harsh the swans nearly died from cold and continuous harsh storms.

On the Jersey Shore, children feed the swans, treating them as delightful ornaments, although when swans feel threatened, they hiss. Experts maintain where friction occurs between swans and people, it is the people, not the birds who are the transgressors. However, as complaints mounted


a federal inspector pronounced a death sentence or removal of the swan. The latter was thwarted under the New Jersey wildlife regulations, a species that cannot be moved to a different habitat. The only option, to humanely euthanize the alleged aggressive bird. Residents balked and contacted the operator of a

who agreed to take the swan if it could be brought to the facility. However, transporting an animal under such circumstances requires a permit from the New Jersey wildlife enforcement agency. Even that hit a wall when the US Department of **Environmental Protection issued** a statement that because of a contract with the agriculture department, New Jersey officials stated the agency does not relocate aggressive, non-native wildlife to zoos or other private settings. On a recent Friday the swan Alfi was to be euthanized. Cries from the community were ignored but the Gods of swans intervened. The man willing to take Alfie received a telephone call reporting a swan was in distress in the waters near Seawood Harbor with fishing gear around its neck. He required help. The owner drove to the area and using bait coaxed the swan back to shore, into his vehicle and back to its facility. Given the bureaucratic obstacles trying to move the swan he said the tangle of fishing line

probably saved its life. A good ending for Alfie but not is deemed invasive for the Children of Lir. When the curse finally lifted the four swans landed on a lake in the South of Ireland. According to legend a fisherman touched the swans and they turned to dust. Moral of the story, don't screw with swans!





A few weeks ago, I was invited to sing at a special celebration in honor of a man called Dan O'Donnell. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to do it, so I contacted Joe Cullen, and my son Declan and they were able to do it. Joe and Declan put on a great show which I had no doubt they would. Dan passed away earlier this year on January 19th so, even though he knew he



was to be honored, he didn't live to see the street sign that was erected in his honor. The street sign is named Dan O'Donnell Way. Dan earned this honor through all the great things he has done in his life, especially in Chicago where he is very fondly remembered and most especially by approximately 1,600 J1 students, who Dan helped over the years.

The story goes that Dan O'Donnell owned a hardware store on Armitage Avenue, Chicago. One day Dan looked out from his store and saw about eight students sitting on their luggage at the bus stop. He heard their Irish accents and found out they had been promised and they all paid him back. He was largely responsible for changing Lincoln Park into a beautiful area from what was once a dangerous place to live.

The ceremony was attended by Kevin Byrne (Irish Consul General) Michelle Smith 43rd

He contacted the priest at a local Catholic school, he then bought blowup mattresses for them. they stayed there for a week until Dan freed up some of his own apartment, and he brought them there. A man from Costa Rica told Joe Cullen the day of the ceremony that shortly after Dan opened his store in 1969, in what was then a bad neighborhood, he started to try to change the area. The man from Costa Rica bought a huge amount of supplies to build his house but had forgotten his wallet. Dan sent him home with everything and told him to pay him Later. He loaned money to several in the neighborhood to build new homes so they could avoid having to get expensive bank loans. He gave them the supplies to build on their honor

Ward Alderwoman and of course Dan's family and hundreds of people that loved Dan so much. Dan's name is spoken with pride in Chicago and Ireland alike. His father Daniel O'Donnell was from Eighter Island, County Donegal, and his mother Nellie (Nee Casey) from Cornamona, County Galway. Thank you to Andy Clarke (Dan's son-in-law) for getting in touch with us to be part of this honor for a great man. Our best wishes to Dan's loving wife of over 59 years, Kathleen, son's and daughter Brian, Kevin, and Erin, and all Dan's famly. Daniel Patrick O'Donnell R.I.P.

Larry Kirwan & Paradise Square: First Chicago Then Broadway!

The multi-talented Larry Kirwan wears a lot of hats. They include composer, *Black 47* band frontman, radio host, columnist, and political activist. He's also an Irish immigrant and a New Yorker. But recently, the two talents that are on the frontline of his repertoire are that of novelist and playwright.

His post 9/11-era inspired third novel, *Rockaway Blue*,

which hit shelves and e-readers this past Spring, earned

high praise from critics and excellent reviews on Amazon and Goodreads.

Later this fall, *Paradise Square*, a fantastic new musical he conceived and helped bring to life, is coming to the James M. Nederlander Theatre in Chicago, before making a run on Broadway beginning in March of

next year. The early word is that it is so good it should garner award nominations.

Kirwan, who hails from Wexford in Ireland, has a simple explanation for his many areas of talent, "I have an interest in all of them, basically."

He's been a columnist with the *Irish Echo* in New York for over a decade, is the host of the Sirius XM radio show *Celtic Crush*, and was the leader of the highly successful American Celtic rock band, *Black 47*, during its 25-year run from 1989-2014.

He's pulled his interest in many of the things he does from his life experiences growing up in Ireland, and being raised by his grandfather. His inspirations include *New York Post* columnist Pete Hamill, listening to rock-n-roll on Radio Luxembourg and on the BBC, and stories told to him about his Great-Grandfather surviving the 'Great Hunger.'

But *Rockaway Blue*, he says, has been simmering inside him since 9/11.

"In New York, the way I see it, there's pre-9/11 and there's post-9/11," he explains. "The city changed because of that, and I really wanted to capture that. Also, (I wanted) to tell the story of regular people who went through 9/11. Not the story on steroids that the politicians used, like the Giuliani and Bush Administrations, to go to war in Iraq. I wanted to tell what it's like for the regular person who might have lost someone. I lost a couple of close friends, but that's nothing compared to losing a family member, and there's so many families in New York who that happened to. I wanted to capture what it was like for them, and where are they now? What's happened to them? Life goes on and they've had to deal with it. That's what the story of *Rockaway Blue* is about."

The date of the book's release can't be ignored. With the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 tragedy happening this year, Kirwan's homage paid to the event and it's victims has been antly timed.

has been aptly timed.

In his writing, and in his music, he tends to tackle big

issues, such as Civil Rights, the Troubles in Ireland, Gay

Rights, 9/11, and the war in Iraq.

"I use them as a backdrop. I'm obviously interested in all of them. But no matter what you're doing in the creative field, if you're a writer or songwriter or playwright, you're constantly looking for drama. And you find drama in those big events. So what I typically try to do with a song, a play, or a novel, is to put a number of characters under stress, under timed stress, and have something coming down the pike at them. Because that's when

people make mistakes, and when you make mistakes, drama happens.

"I use the songs, in particular, to rally people, and to wake them up. I don't believe that the songwriter or the writer should be advocating their way of things. It's getting people to wake up and react in their own way."

This creative tool feeds into both his most recent book, and into his upcoming

show, *Paradise Square*, a truly enormous project that has been in the making for nearly a decade.

The musical, which had its world premiere at the Berkeley Repertory Theatre in 2018-2019, is set in Manhattan in 1863, in an area known as the Five Points. There, during that time, Black Americans and Irish Immigrants lived together, worked together, married and had children together, and for a short period in history, realized racial harmony, all within the political backdrop of the Civil War.

"I was the conceiver of it, and I'm a co-writer, and I did some of the music. It's a big project," he says.

The idea was sparked while Kirwan was growing up in Ireland, hearing stories from his Grandfather about the Five Points, the famous dance halls there, and its high rate of crime. "He saw it as a cesspool where the Irish, went when they came over (to America) in the 19th century, were going to the Five Points, and you'd never hear about them again."

But rather than avoiding the area when he finally emigrated to New York, Kirwan discovered that he lived very close to it, and would frequently go there to visit. "I used to go down to the Five Points, which has changed, of course... (I'd) try and visualize where were these dance halls? What was it like down here for the Irish?

"Around that time, I was a big reader, and I used to haunt the second hand bookstores of Greenwich Village. And one day, I came upon a book...It was about New York in the 1800s, and to my amazement, there were etchings of the African-American dance halls in the Five Points. It was a revelation, because I could actually see who was there. I was really interested in the bands, because I knew they were integrated. There were usually four people in the band. There would be an Irish fiddle player, an Irish singer, an African-American banjo player, and an African-American percussionist.

"But then, the biggest revelation came when I started to look at the dancers. It was always a Black man, a white Irish woman, and there was the look of joy and delight

on their faces. I could feel a love that beamed across the centuries that told me that these people were romantically attached. That's when I started to do more investigating, and found out that yeah, these unions had really happened.

"There were so many Irish and African-American unions, marriages, children, that the participants actually had a name. They were called Amalgamationists. The people themselves didn't use that name. The authorities and the establishment uptown who really frowned on these unions, they came up with that name."

This discovery and subsequent research inspired Kirwan to write the musical *Hard Times*, the first iteration of Paradise Square.

Manhattan. It got a really good *New York Times* review. A gentleman came to see it one night, Peter LeDonne, and he loved it and said 'Would it be ok to send the book and songs to my friend and associate,' the great empresario and producer Garth Drabinsky, up in Toronto. Garth loved it and invited me up and said 'Can we work on this?.'

"So, I created another couple of characters. Garth's genius was to expand the concept. Hard Times was set

"Because (it all) ended on the night of July 13, 1863, during the Draft Riots. Amalgamationists were attacked, 11 African-Americans were killed and there was much burning and looting. This was during the Civil War, a week after the Battle of Gettysburg, when ultimate Union victory was still not assured."

The production was expanded once Drabinsky became involved. The story was fleshed out, characters were added, music was newly written or re-imagined. A phenomenal creative team was put together and brought on board, in order to learn how to mix in with the different communities. give a larger life to the broadened script.

"(Garth) brought in a lot of talented artists, including neighborhood in the lower East side of Manhattan. Defi-


were not unlike the dance halls where the Irish immigrants fraternized with African-Americans. They weren't that different. It was the same rules within them, I would imagine. I learned a lot in those clubs that I was able to use within songs for Black 47, and story lines for Hard Times, and for Paradise Square."

As with any musical, the choreography is key to Paradise Square, but it plays a much more central role in this particular show than it does in many others.

"Dancing is really important in any musical, but in Paradise Square, I think it's paramount. When the Irish went to the African-American dance halls, they (all) had dancing in common. It was a universal language. Both communities loved to dance, they watched each other danc-

ing, and then eventually, they began to have contests between them. "We're blessed that we have Bill T. Jones,

who is an amazing choreographer. He challenges everyone to get to the heart of what you're doing. "I knew if we were going to incorporate

Irish dancing into the play, we were going to need Irish dancers who were not only experts at their craft, but were also people who were really willing to go out on a limb. And the dancers I thought could do that to listen to what other people want to do, best were a company called

Hammerstep, (co-founded by) Jason Oremus and Garrett Coleman. They were friends of mine, and were already using hip hop beats and different styles of urban dance. So I had a feeling that they would be the ones who would really spark from Bill's influence, and that's been the case.

"When you look at Irish dance now, the upper body and the arms are usually rigid. And that's what we were working with at first. But then I went out one night and saw Sean-Nós dance, which was a style that was more prevalent on the West

coast of Ireland, and I realized that this was what the Irish brought over with them. The stiff-backed and stiff-armed Irish dancing was more a later reaction to the religious authorities who wanted Irish dancing to stay really chaste, so breasts and upper bodies wouldn't provide "an occasion for sin."

But Sean-Nós' dancing was very open, your arms could move, your body could move. And that's what sparked the competitions and the collaborations with the African-American dancers. Sean-Nós was a perfect partner for the African 'sway' moves and the dances that they had taken with them from Africa. What our choreographers have created is a glorious thing on stage - an amalgam of African-American and Irish dancing.

When you watch these dancers and you watch the collaborations they come up with, you can feel you're back in 1863, when these two brutalized people - one fleeing famine and political oppression, and the other fleeing enslavement came together. It's something that we've experienced in the last seven years, that when we put young Irish dancers and young Africa-American dancers together, they come up with a whole new world that is just wonderful to

both behold and become part of."

When asked what it is that he thinks makes a musical tick, he says,

"Just one word: Collaboration. You can't imagine the scope of these musicals. I don't know how Garth Drabinsky holds the whole thing together. You must possess a great brain, and you almost have to be a psychiatrist in ways, to deal with all the ambitions and egos that are involved. You have to be willing to give up some of your own ideas, and adopt other people's ideas, and learn



because everyone has a say in what goes on in a musical. From the actors, to the choreographer, to the director, and the producer. So, collaboration is the name of the game, and if you can do it with goodwill, all the better, and you'll definitely come out learning a lot."

Paradise Square comes to Chicago November 2nd and will run through December 5th. Kirwan plans to attend every night of the previews, as well as opening night.

"When you come, you'll see the amazing, talented cast we have. I'm looking forward to seeing what Chicago thinks of it."



Scions

With major news events occurring daily, 'fast and furious', some headlined, others studiously ignored by the press, it's barely possible to absorb it all, much less piece

it together. I suppose that's the purpose of blitzkrieg. We are in a political process that began before we all were born and have arrived at a point where that process is being pushed to critical mass.

President Biden, long-time Delaware tax haven overseer, named Antony Blinken Secretary of State. Blinken has now called on the U.N. to mount an inquisition into the U.S. white race to judge its "racism". The subject's not death or taxes, so I can't be certain another race won't be grilled.

Blinken: "The United States intends to issue a formal, standing invitation to all UN experts who report and advise on thematic human rights issues. As a first step, we have reached out to offer an official visit by the UN Special Rapporteur on contemporary forms of racism and the UN Special Rapporteur on minority issues."

Will the "Rappor" be on tour to rap the skulls of the mostly Christian and working-class folks living in the suburbs of solid one-party welfare cities as he pours the chrism of critical race theory on their white-privileged brows? Will the sanctified and progressive academic and corporate elites come forth from their gated, walled and monitored estates to assist in this awakening from original sin?

We haven't heard if Rapporteur will be from China, which the Global Slavery Index reported in 2018 had 3.8 million slaves; or from India, the country with the highest number of slave people (14.3 million) in the world. But I don't think the Rapporteur will be calling many scions to the river. (I'm talking about aristocratic heirs, not the Scions the ones you drive that handicap your aristocratic airs.)

When President Biden's scion, Hunter, graduated Yale at 21, he landed a super job at MBNA. The world's largest credit card bank desperately needed a consultant. Hunter oozed so much talent, he made executive vice president in two years flat. Later, heeding the call from President Clinton to serve his country, he left MBNA to join the U.S. Department of Commerce. But the bank showed its gratitude by continuing Hunter's payments. When he became a lobbyist Hunter's sense of honesty was confirmed once again when he established a "don't ask, don't tell"

relationship with his dad, who was hard at



work on bankruptcy legislation affecting banks: "Joe wouldn't ask Hunter about his lobbying clients; and Hunter wouldn't tell his father about them."

Hunter really enjoyed his work with fellow scions. He partnered with Chris Heinz, scion of Secretary of State John Kerry, brokering big gas deals with Ukraine's Burisma. Hunter also partnered with the Thornton Group, run by James Bulger, nephew of late uncle "Whitey", and scion of Massachusetts state senator Billy Bulger.

Billionaire George Soros has been more than helpful to budding political scions. He reportedly set a new personal record in his efforts to tilt US elections in 2020, donating more than \$50 million for left-wing causes and candidates. He had only poured \$22 million into the 2016 presidential election. Soros has also pumped tens of millions of dollars into local races in Texas, Colorado, California, Oregon, Washington, Florida, and New York, as well as swing states like Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Arizona. He spent \$2 million on a single sheriff race in Arizona, and \$1.7 million to elect Larry Krasner, scion of Russian immigrants, as DA in Philadelphia. Quoth Soros: "The main obstacle to a stable and just world order is the United States." And "Changing the attitude and policies of the United States remains my top priority".

Krasner won the 2017 Democratic primary with 38% of the vote, making him a shoo-in for the general election (Democrats in Philadelphia have nearly a 7-1 advantage in registered voters). What is Soros buying? His first week in office, Krasner fired 31 prosecutors. His office dropped drug charges against suspected killer Hassan Elliott. Elliott was arrested again for cocaine possession while on probation for a gun charge and released on his own recognizance. A week later, Elliott took part in a fatal shooting. When he didn't appear for the drug charge, a warrant was issued for the shooting. The following month Elliott was charged with murdering Philadelphia police officer James O'Connor IV. On the night of O'Connor's death, Philadelphia police officers formed a human chain at Temple University Hospital entrance to

Temple University Hospital entrance to prevent Krasner from entering.
San Francisco's new DA, is Chesa Boudin, a former translator for the late Venezuelan

socialist dictator Hugo Chavez. Boudin is also the scion of two Weather Underground domestic terrorists convicted of murder for a Brink's armored car robbery that killed three people. Boudin was raised by Obama advisor and U of I pro-

fessor, former Weather Underground leader Bill Ayers. At Oxford, Boudin earned two master's degrees, one in forced migration. Boudin is one of the DAs on this list who refuses to prosecute what he calls "quality-of-life crimes" such as camping in the streets, offering or soliciting sex, public urination, etc.

Did you know "Secretary" drives from the Latin secretarius "person entrusted with secrets"? New Secretary of State, Antony Blinken is a scion of investment banker Donald Blinken and his second wife, Vera, Hungarians who have made major bequests to the Central European University (CEU) founded by George Soros. The Open Society Archives at CEU is named for them. Clinton appointed Tony's uncle, Alan, as ambassador to Belgium, then named his father ambassador to Hungary. Young Antony also showed talent early. He coasted into Harvard, interned at the New Republic magazine, organized a film festival and hosted a celebration for filmmaker Spike Lee. In 1998, Antony Blinken was named Chancellor of the International Council of CEU. He later became a member of its Board of Trustees and serves as one of its Emeritus Trustees.

ers~itinerants~gypsies? lucht and possessions of the deceased, siúil in Irish, the walking people. They say the "traveling people" broke away from the settled people over 400 years ago. There several superstitions surround are several theories how "traveling people" started. A. That they are related to the Celtic people that invaded Ireland, B. They became homeless during the Cromwell period in 1650, C. They are related to people that were evicted from their homes during the famine or D. that Ireland has always had travelers.

They are an indigenous minority and live in very close-knit communities. They are mostly Catholic and pay detailed attention to issues of healing. Their traditions are all oral, unwritten. They were once known for being great storytellers. (Homer's Iliad & Odyssey were passed down through oral tradition)

Travelers have been ostracized over the years which has contributed to mental health problems. Co. Galway has the most concentration of travelers. They do odd jobs such as cleaning chimneys, fortune telling, scrap metal and deal in horse past they worked as tinsmith (a person who works in tin) hence the name 'tinker'. It's said after the death of a family

Who are the tinkers-travel- member they burn the caravan for fear of the individual's ghost or bad luck.

They are a nomadic group & them, burial rituals, taboos and folklore. They inter-marry, marrying a cousin is normal and a common occurrence. Research was done by Murphy & Croke they identified a certain genetic disease such as galacstomia (genetic blood metabolic disorder) of being much more common in the traveler population.

A common practice among travelers is bare knuckle boxing, travelers are known to be fighters and it's said they solve their issues with fighting. Francie Barrett, a traveler, a professional boxer represented Ireland in the Olympics in 1996.

Travelers received ethnic status in 2017, formally recognized by the government as a minority group. There are roughly 35,000 in Ireland today. There are also Irish travelers in England, Scotland and the US. (Texas, S. Carolina, Tennessee, Georgia, Arkansas, Mississippi, Florida & New York)

Some sad statistics about trading & dog breeding. In the travelers is men are 6 times more likely to commit suicide that settled men. The health of travelers is significantly poorer than the settled population.

Traveler children often grow up outside the traditional education system meaning less opportunity & growth.

"Family and friends of the person leaving for the foreign lands would travel this far .Here was the separation. This is the bridge of tears".

So I guess long before roads and railways this was the route they took to get to the docks in Derry to pick up passage to America. Austrailia. England. Scotland. It was said that their loved ones who walked with them would mourn their departure like a death as they knew most of them would never return home. Years would go by and families would still tearfully sit and pray for their loved ones by the bridge. My daughter asked me how many of our family members left home including myself I just said a lot as I was over taken with emotion thinking how my poor mother felt upon our departure across the Atlantic. It really doesn't hit you until you have your own children. We all tried to go home every few years as back then the flights were expensive but our hero. Tommy Ryan who owned a travel Agency was so wonderfully kind to all us young Irish. He would let us pay our airfare in installments even long after we got back to Chicago. We all loved Tommy he was a real gentleman.

Aer Lingus is Ready to Take You Back to Ireland and Beyond!

Vice President of Global Sales took time out to discuss with Irish American News what they are doing to make it easier for us in the U.S. to get to Ireland.

Bill received a bachelor's degree from Loyola University of Chicago and a Masters and Ph.D. from the Illinois Institute of Technology. Byrne is a native of Chicago and a dual National of the U.S. and Ireland. He is married and the father of four children.

Q. Bill, you've got a long, very distinguished background that looks like a great fit with Aer Lingus. When did you join Aer Lingus and what do you hope to accomplish with them?

A. I started with Aer Lingus in January of 2018. I came over from Hertz, and before that I spent 30 years with United Airlines. Most of my focus has been on international travel for the last 25 years.

So what we're trying to accomplish with Aer Lingus is to expand in the US. We fly to more cities now than we did when Aer Lingus first started going to the US. Our history in the US was predominantly Chicago, Boston, New York, and eventually San Francisco and Washington. Now we fly to 14 cities in North America, including Miami, Orlando, Seattle. We try to fly wherever there are Irish Americans to provide as much non-stop service as possible. In the near term we are really trying to make sure that all those routes are effective and profitable again.

We are reaching out to Irish American communities across the country so that they know where they can catch a direct flight to Ireland. The biggest issue with travel to Ireland for so many years rect flight out of three cities, so you had to connect to those cities from anywhere else in the country.

When you can provide direct access, you get so much more increased tourism because people like to fly nonstop, as opposed to flying with a stopover. And so what we have found is as we've expanded, we've been able to grow the direct service into Ireland in terms of tourism. So, we're working on having more direct flights to Ireland. Along with that, we hope people will see us as a gateway to other cities in Europe as we fly

You can fly Aer Lingus from Los Angeles and can connect in Dublin to other cities in Europe; whether it's Paris, Venice, Amsterdam, London, Manchester, Glasgow and more. The second thing we're trying to get people to realize is not only should we be your choice for return to Ireland, but we should be your choice of airlines to other cities in Europe as well. Once you are in Ireland you are only a short flight from Europe!

Passengers are familiar with our product and with Dublin airport and what we do. They're familiar with the service, they like the service. You get that Irish welcome, you're not going to get anywhere else in the world except on our flights! Transiting in Dublin, it's really easy. It's a relatively small airport and easy to transfer. We think it's a very good choice.

Q. The pandemic has shaken and stirred things guite a bit. Many of the folks that I've talked to about going to Ireland, are apprehensive and confused about what will be open and what they can see and do while they are

Instead, it is about being able to travel around without a lot of hassle and red tape while they are there. They're afraid pubs and major attractions will be closed, what would you tell them?

A. I don't blame them for being confused. And I don't blame them for being apprehensive. Up until recently, Ireland had the most restrictive COVID policies across Europe, but those have been substantially relaxed now. Fully vaccinated people don't have to quarantine or take a PCR test. If they have children 11 and under accompanying them, they also don't have to take a PCR test. Children 12-17 do have to take a PCR test. It is easy to sort it out though.

Folks just have to go on the website in Ireland, www.dfa.ie, and that will tell them everything they need to know. Our website, AerLingus.com, also has the information they want.

So for a single or a couple that have been vaccinated to they'll probably have to show their CDC vaccine card. Our airport people have examples of pretty much every vaccine card that exists.

I would also tell travelers to make sure they bring their CDC card that they would have gotten when they got their vaccination. When they present that at checkin they will be allowed to board. They will have to complete an electronic passenger locator form which is relatively easy. And all that does is it allows the health services to track somebody down

will have to be completed 48 hours before departure. And, as far as I know, there's no need to take a temperature for fully vaccinated passengers.

I would advise people to the extent that they can, to look at social media and look at the web to see what kinds of things are open. Because if a particular museum is the one thing you want to see, then you can make sure it is open.

Pubs are opening, tourist attractions and hotels are opening up. So I think very soon people will see everything is wide open that they normally want to see whether it's Giants Causeway, or the Ring of Kerry. They're all open as you would think they would be.

What travelers will find now is a country that has been waiting for them for 18 months, and can't wait for them to get back! And they will have a wonderful time.

Q. How many airlines does Aer Lingus have to compete with? And why should we fly Aer Lingus and not one of them?

A. So out of the U.S. on a non stop basis its Delta, United, and American Airlines.

And on a connecting basis you can get to Ireland a whole variety of ways. I think the biggest thing I would say is we're the Irish airline, Right? So we've been flying to Ireland since 1962 and we are good at it!

If the world seems focused on experiences, the Peoria Irish Fest's low-key vibe is intentional. Guests' mindsets are shaped when greeted by entry signs proclaiming 'You are now entering Ireland on the Illinois River.' Around 12,000 are expected Tickets at the door will cost to flow through the gates over three days. So even a crowded day is easy for everyone to event as both a peaceful place manage.

"We offer an experience that is meant to be savored slowly, not swallowed hole," said Event Co-Chair, John Martin. "We try to arrange our fest like a small Irish town. Guests who have visited Ireland have noticed, and complimented us on the effort we make."

On the edge of 'town,' the sports field invites guests to try their hand at the Highland Games (Saturday) before the athletes get down to serious competition (Sunday). Axe throwing lets everyone channel their inner Celtic warrior, too.

Next to the sports field is the large community dance / music hall. It's just one of the fest's five pubs and four entertainment stages. "We feature artist workshops in our smallest venue," said Martin. "Our guests are literally within an arm's reach of the weekend's headliners.

"We've tried to build our where families gather every year ... yet everyone can find an exciting show, too."

It doesn't bother McConnaughay or Martin if anyone calls their fest 'small time.' They feel it's just the right size and - far more importantly - entertainers, vendors and guests enjoy being

"When bands here for the first time check out, they often remark how friendly everyone has been - staff and guests alike," said McConnaughay.


"That's just how we are. We're all friends here."

Understanding Workers Compensation Benefits

If you suffer am injury on the job, you may be entitled to workers' compensation benefits. This month's article is to give you a better understanding of the requirements needed to receive workers' compensation benefits and what some of those benefits are. As always if you have questions regarding a work-related injury or incident, please do not hesitate to call me here at Dwyer & Coogan, all of our consultations are free.

Requirements: The Illinois Workers' Compensation Act (820 ILCS 305, etal.) provides relief to employees who are injured in the course of their work. In order to receive workers' compensation benefits three requirements must be met:

- 1. You have suffered an injury while in the course of your employment;
- 2. The injury arose out of the course of employment;
- 3. The employee notified the employer/supervisor of the injury.

In short, what these requirements mean is that the injury must have occurred while doing something in the course of your job and that the injury actually resulted from an activity related to your employment. Furthermore, you must notify your employer or supervisor of the injury within 45 days of the injury or incident occurring. This time frame is very important so please seek advice regarding a work related injury as soon as possible.

Benefits: If above-mentioned requirements are met, you may be entitled to the following benefits:

- 1. Medical Expenses,
- 2. Temporary Total Disability ("TTD"), and

the medical expenses incurred through hospitalization or rehabilitation are, and should be, paid for by the employer. The treatment must be reasonable and necessary and assist in the injured employee's recovery.

The medical expenses must be incurred as

a result of the injury. An extremely important caveat to this and what we advise all of our clients to do is to make sure that you mention to your treater that your injury was from work. In the workers compensation system, there is a huge difference between a doctors note that mentions that you are injured versus a doctors note that mentions that you are injured specifically because of a work-related activity, injury or incident.

Temporary Total Disability ("TTD"): In the event that your injury prevents you from performing your job and otherwise forces you to take time off of work you may be entitled to TTD benefits. Again, it is important that your medical doctor feels that you cannot perform your job during your recovery period and states that in your medical records. TTD is calculates as 66% of your gross average weekly wage and should continue for as long as you are unable to perform the job.

Partial Permanent Disability ("PPD")

Employers are required to pay PPD benefits to injured employees who have suffered from a physical impair-






